Webinar Series

The committee ran a 3-part webinar series in 2022 on Speech Management for Children with Cleft Lip and Palate: State of the Art Management. Transforming Faces-IALP Mentoring Project

This project was initiated by Triona Sweeney, in consultation with the cleft charity Transforming Faces. The project aims to provide support to SLTs from lower- and middle-income countries where professional support and supervision are often limited. The project is currently in its third round. Members of the committee continue to participate actively as mentors. The committee has also been invited to present a Q and A webinar on cleft for all mentees and mentors in the second round. 2 sessions were run to meet both the Asia and Africa time zones.

14th International Cleft Congress, Edinburgh, 2022

On behalf of the committee, Valerie Pereira presented a paper entitled 'The Cleft Palate and Craniofacial committee of the International Association of Communication Disorders and Sciences (IALP)' to increase awareness of the committee's work and activities and engagement of potential new members. Triona Sweeney presented a paper entitled 'Evaluation of a mentorship program for speech & language therapists in resource-constrained contexts' which outlined the qualitative results of the first year of the mentorship project with IALP and the cleft charity Transforming Faces.

32nd World Congress of the IALP, New Zealand, 2023

Yoshiko Takei, Mikaela Bow and Valerie Pereira represented the committee for the Standing Committee session on "Evidence-based Speech Intervention in Cleft Palate/Velopharyngeal Dysfunction". In addition to the Standing Committee session, members presented other papers (oral and poster) at the congress.

Global Speech Task Force of the International Confederation of Cleft Lip and Palate and Related Craniofacial Anomalies (ICCPCA)

Debbie Sell and Suraj Subramaniyan led the Global Speech Task Force.
